Ninth International Conference on Africa and Its Diaspora (BICAID 2025) November 5 – 7, 2025

The African Studies Institute (ASI), University of Georgia, Athens, Georgia is accepting proposals for its three-day international conference on Africa and Its Diaspora from November 5 - 7, 2025. This year's conference is proposed in a <u>hybrid</u> format with participants opting to make their presentation either in person or virtually. This year's theme is "Africa at the Crossroads of Global Politics: Indigenous Knowledge, Youth Agency, and Diaspora Partnerships."

In an era marked by dynamic global power shifts, the African continent stands at a historic junction where it must navigate urgent political, economic, cultural, and environmental conjunctions. The **2025 Biennial International Conference on Africa and Its Diaspora** (**BICAID 2025**) will explore Africa's ascending role in global politics, the transformational power of its youth population, the resilient knowledge embedded in its indigenous traditions, and the strategic interventions of its diaspora communities. **BICAID 2025** invites scholars, practitioners, policymakers, and students to join us in a robust interdisciplinary dialogue on Africa's local, continental, and global agency. The conference theme encourages critical reflection on contemporary African and Diaspora responses to pressing global challenges, with emphases on language revitalization, sustainable development, cultural resilience, youth leadership, and transnational alliances.

This year's theme builds upon two major exploratory elements. The first is a reflection on the deliberations and published findings surrounding the leitmotifs of the past eight BICAID conferences. The second involves recent scholarly engagements by members and affiliates of the University of Georgia African Studies Institute (UGA–ASI) concerning five key Afrocentric topics:

• The significance of Africa's ascending youth demographic (over 60% under age 25)



- The impactful remittances and return migrations from Africa's Diaspora populations
- The role of African Indigenous Knowledge Systems (AIKS) in policy, education, sustainability, and wellness on the African continent and its Diaspora.
- Africa's entanglement in global crises—war, migration, climate change—and its potential leadership role
- Africa's position in relation to shifting Western foreign policy and global governance norms.

Given the current crisis laden international relations, the confounding state of democratic systems around the world, and Africa's sputtering socio-economic development, conference organizers are optimistic that the deliberations about this rather capaciously conceived theme will allow for the contemplation of different critical issues of intellectual importance to Africans and members of the African Diaspora. Within the broad theme of the conference, proposals are welcome from across disciplines and geographic focus. Possible topics include but are not limited to:

- African Indigenous Knowledge Systems (AIKS)
- Indigenous African Languages & Epistemologies
- Africa's Youth and Political Leadership
- Diaspora Return Migrations and Remittances
- Language Empowerment and Multilingualism
- Environmental Justice and Climate Resilience
- Religion, Spirituality, and Development
- Art, Film, and Cultural Expression
- Migration, Displacement, and Border Politics
- Technology, Innovation, and Infrastructural Futures
- Gender, Power, and Equity in Africa and Its Diaspora
- Human Rights, Peace, and Transitional Justice
- Education, Knowledge Transmission, and Curriculum Decolonization
- Health Systems and Community-Based Wellness Approaches



- Africa in Global Diplomacy and South-South Collaboration
- Neocolonialism, Debt, and Economic Dependency

TYPES OF PRESENTATION:

Abstracts that extend beyond the theme of the conference WILL NOT be considered.

- Oral Presentation Session

Full Paper-Completed research work

- Panel / Roundtable Session

Position papers/literature reviews that call for large audience participation. Authors give a brief presentation on the topic or a synopsis. This session is normally about 40 minutes to allow audience interaction.

• Conference presentations can be either in person or virtually – links, presentation formats and other details will be forthcoming.

Submission Guidelines

We invite the following types of submissions:

- Individual Papers: Original, completed research or well-developed theoretical reflections
- **Panel Proposals:** 2–3 presenters around a unifying theme, ideally interdisciplinary
- **Roundtables/Workshops:** Interactive formats emphasizing audience participation or collaborative inquiry

Abstracts <u>must not</u> be more than **300 words**, followed by **five (5) keywords**. Please include:

- Title of paper or session
- Presenter's full name and institutional affiliation
- Email address and phone number
- Presentation format (Paper, Panel, or Roundtable)
- Anticipated mode of presentation (In-person or Virtual)



Brief bio (100 words max) for each presenter must accompany the abstract.
